Exertional heat stroke in a warming climate: prevention, recognition, and treatment

The 2025 Hilliard Distinguished Lecture in Sports Medicine, sponsored by the Huffines Institute, features **Dr. Douglas Casa**. He is a Professor in Kinesiology and Director of Athletic Training at the University of Connecticut. He also serves as the Chief Executive Officer for the Kory Stringer Institute. He has published more than 200 peer-reviewed publications/book chapters and presented more than 400 times on subjects related to exertional heat stroke, heat-related illnesses, preventing sudden death in sport, and hydration. Dr. Casa has successfully treated 225 cases of exertional heat stroke with zero fatalities. Dr. Casa developed the Kory Stringer Institute (KSI) at the University of Connecticut with the mission to provide research, education, advocacy, and consultation to maximize performance, optimize safety, and prevent sudden death for the athlete, warfighter, and laborer
